### **PURPOSE**

 To prepare high school students for career readiness and civic engagement, and to present an opportunity for adults to achieve additional credibility and higher achievement levels.

# **Key Players**

 Developer: is the institution [City of Snellville & Partners] who desires to award a badge recognizing a skill or knowledge.

**Issuer:** have the technical capability [LRNG Platform] to encrypt the badge to those receiving a badge from the developer.

 Learner: are those who are rewarded for completing different projects, demonstrating various skills, and/or passing a standard-based credential.

- Water Treatment Badge (Obtained after learning Water Treatment Market Segments or PSF Value Spectrum)

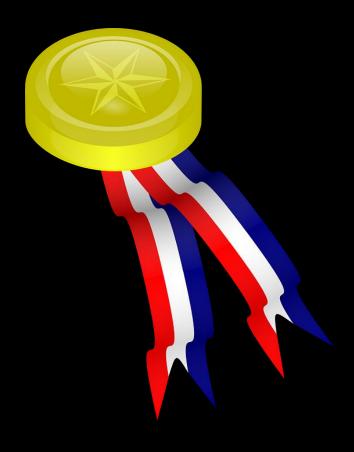
